MEETING OF THE LOCAL SUPERIORS, DOWS & CCMS

A two-day meeting (Nov 13-14) of the Local Superiors, Directors of Works, Commission for Choice of Ministries of the province was held at Prerana. The theme of the meeting was 'Row into the Deep'. Fr Provincial through a brief input on the vow of poverty invited the group to reflect over personal, communal and institutional poverty in order to arrive at some concrete points for implementation. After the input and personal prayer, the group had spiritual conversation and the plenary. The entire exercise was done in a spirit of introspection and openness.

On this occasion, "Naanu Mooka Prekshakanalla' (Kannada translation of Fr. Stan Swamy's book 'I am not a silent spectator') by Dr Vincent and Ms. Lilly Therese, was released; and



the writers were appreciated and honoured. Fr. Maxim Dias, coordinator of the Province Task Force on promoting pluralism, suggested possible ways and means to address the issue. The

other topics for deliberation were: Review of the Implementation of KPAP by Fr Ronald Pais, Discernment on our apostolic intervention at Haliyal by Fr Anil D'Souza, and youth ministry by Fr Maxim Dias.

The second day was marked by the joyful celebration of Fr John Pradeep's birthday and the blessing of the renovated cemetery by Fr Provincial. In the session that followed, Fr Teyol Machado made a presentation of the study done on our apostolic intervention at Koppal and Yadgir. While Frs Don Lobo and Santhosh Walder made a study on Koppal, Frs Teyol Machado and Alwyn D'Souza did a study on Yadgir. Our Province is grateful to them for their contribution. Fr Melwin J Pinto presented the evaluation report of the Secondary Schools by the JEASA. Ms Prameetha Adoni shared with us the rationale behind the NEP and the future course of action vis-à-vis the NEP in Karnataka.

A plethora of doubts and queries were raised in connection with the recently introduced 'personal account system' which were clarified, calmly and coolly, by our dynamic province treasurer Fr. Jason Furtado. At the end of the meeting Fr. Provincial addressed the whole group with words of appreciation and encouragement, not without drawing our attention to a few challenges. FACELIFT TO THE MOUNT ST JOSEPH CEMETERY $\frac{A}{\delta}$ $\frac{\sigma}{G}$

As the available burial space in the MSJ cemetery was insufficient, the need was felt for its revamping and renovation. When the same was intimated to the provincial, he at once vibrated with the idea of giving a facelift to the cemetery. Hence the work began in right earnest in April 2022 with Mr. Justin Fernandes as the architect and Mr. Loy D'Mello as the contractor.

Fr Provincial took keen interest in the entire renovation project, visited the cemetery several times and closely monitored the work. Fr Anthony Joseph personally monitored the work despite all hassles. Fr Jason Furtado looked into the logistics. Fr Clarence D'Souza was a great help in providing the data of the departed Jesuits while exhuming the 42 graves and putting the mortal remains in the urns and depositing them in the 42 niches built in the form of a honeycomb. Now, we have provision for 60 more burials in 20 graves. We have altogether 72 niches to keep the urns built in the hexagonal shape. The renovation work started with the



exhumation of the graves which was a herculean task as the workers, mostly Hindus, were a bit scared and hesitant, to work in the cemetery. This and the incessant rains slowed down the work. Despite all these difficulties and pitfalls,

SJCC GOLDEN JUBILEE CELEBRATIONS

Formerly a department of St Joseph's College (SJC) since 1949, St Joseph's College of Commerce (SJCC) became an independent college in 1972 with its own building on Brigade Road. The year 2022 marks the 50th anniversary of its establishment. The college has the unique distinction of being the only single-discipline college in

the project was completed in November 2022.

The splendid fruit of the hard labour of the architect, the contractor and the laborers can be now seen in the beautiful cemetery which has an elegant and imposing structure. The blessing of the renovated cemetery was done by our Provincial, Fr Dionysius Vaz, on 13 November 2022, the feast of St Stanislaus Kostka, the youngest of our saints who died when he was not yet 18. The cemetery is so attractive that



some of the Superiors and DoWs present at the blessing were heard saying that they are dying to come here.

The cemetery has a new look and a beautiful garden. Our novices under the guidance of the Novice Master Fr. John Pradeep and the Socius Fr. Nithin Machado did a wonderful job in creating new alleys with a variety of flower plants all along the cemetery wall, a few alleys lining the main path leading to the crucifix. The crucifix itself, with a canopy, is the cynosure of all eyes.

With its new and very attractive look, the MSJ cemetery is indeed a worthy memorial to the "Resurrecturis" as the inscription on the pedestal of the cemetery cross notes, to those who are awaiting the resurrection. - Fr Richard Sequeira


