PROVINCIAL'S MUSINGS

The South Zone Provincials visited Sri Lanka from 16-23 January for their annual meeting. The purpose of the visit was to have a first-hand experience of the situation in Sri Lanka, to enhance our collaboration in the South Zone, and to be in solidarity with Sri Lanka in this time of economic recession and crisis.

Sri Lanka is geopolitically of strategic importance for the larger world and especially for India. It has been exploited both within the country by corrupt politicians as well as by other nations including China and India. With the nationalization of education in the 1960's, Jesuits handed over their educational institutions to the government and were left with parishes, social centres and retreat houses. The 40-year ethnic conflict and war divided the country ending in bloodshed in 2009. The tsunami in 2004 hit the country and many lost their lives. Sri Lanka's economy is dependent on tourism and the production of tea. With the pandemic badly hitting tourism and the Sri Lankan government's decision to go for organic farming resulting in lower production of tea, the economy had a downslide and the recession has left the country in shambles.

Visiting Sri Lanka province was an eye-opener for all the provincials of the South Zone. On the one hand, the topography of Sri Lanka is beautiful, green and scenic. On the other hand, people are very poor and the rich have migrated. Shops are open but people have no buying power. Most of the Jesuit communities and institutions in the North of Sri Lanka are managed by only one Jesuit, their houses are rented or dilapidated, their people are poor and the students are unable to pay the fees during this time of economic crisis.

Sri Lanka province is requesting support from the South Zone provinces in terms of Jesuit personnel, funding the formation of scholastics in India, financial support for their Learning Centres that is run with the help of JWJ and support for the construction of their school building in Galle.

There is a lot of connection between the provinces of Sri Lanka and Karnataka. Many of the senior Jesuits did their Novitiate and Juniorate in Mount St Joseph. I appeal to our communities and well-off institutions to lend a helping hand to the province of Sri Lanka. Any Jesuit who wishes to volunteer for a year or more are welcome to begin a conversation with me.

LEADERSHIP ENHANCEMENT AND ANIMATION PROGRAMME (LEAP)

Leadership Enhancement and Animation Programme was held at Prerana, Bengaluru for Jesuit School Principals and Managers of Southern Jesuit Provinces (Kerala, Karnataka, Madurai, Chennai and Andhra) from 19 January to 22 January 2023.

Fr Joseph A D'Mello, SJ, the Vice-Provincial of Karnataka Jesuit Province, in his inaugural address highlighted the role of Jesuit Institutions



in the VUCA world (volatility, uncertainty, complexity, and ambiguity). PLATINUM JUBILEE OF SJU BOYS' HOSTEL, Bengaluru

January 26, 2023 was a remarkable day in the history of St Joseph's College Hostel as it celebrated the Republic Day, along with the 75th anniversary of inception of the Hostel. The foundation of the hostel building was laid by the late Fr Charles Andrade - the first warden of the hostel - on 12 March 1947, a few months before our country's first Independence Day. The semi-circular building, designed by a Jesuit from Visakhapatnam, had a basement and three floors, and the area enclosed by the semicircle was converted into a beautiful garden with a magnificent statue of the Sacred Heart of Jesus at the center.

Since then, the Hostel has been a home away from home to generations of students from far and near who have been shaped and molded under the guidance of towering personalities as

wardens, directors and staff, continuing the legacy of all-round formation etching itself in the annals of history.

The Platinum Jubilee celebration of the hostel was graced by the presence of Fr Dionysius Vaz, Provincial, as the chief guest, and former hostellers



C.A. Vittal Rao, and C.A. Ravi Lobo as the guests of honour. Other dignitaries present were Fr Victor Lobo, Vice-Chancellor of SJU, Fr Swebert D'Silva, Rector of Arrupe Nivas, and Fr John Baptist, Director of the Hostel. The invitees to the grand celebration were SJU Faculty, ex-hostellers of SJCH and hostellers of St Joseph's Girls' Hostel.
