PROVINCIAL'S MUSINGS

e have begun the New Year 2024 with great energy after a very fruitful Province Sammelan at the end of December 2023. The purpose of the Province Sammelan was to foster our union and to discern about how to be relevant in our mission in the present times. We are a young Province of 319 members, with 218 priests, 1 Brother, 86 scholastics and 14 novices. We have 89 young priests (ordained approved scholastics). We have 16 Jesuit communities and our average age in the province is 42.

The Province Sammelan with the keynote address, the State of the Province Report, the SWOC analysis of the various commissions, the panel discussion by lay partners and the spiritual conversations have yielded much fruit. It has helped strengthen the province internally by building bonds, brought more clarity and freshness to the province; focused on the overall growth of the province to remain relevant, professional, more systematic in achieving the vision and mission of the province, and helped discuss the future direction of the province.

Biologists talk about DNA, the genetic material in the cells of living organisms. What is the DNA of the Jesuits of Karnataka Province? First, a commitment to excellence in everything we do: Magis, depth and discernment. Second, a spirit of addressing the context in collaboration, an eagerness to work together with other groups. Third, a commitment to diversity and creating opportunities for our option groups. These three elements are the cornerstones of Karnataka Province's strength.

We are in challenging times faced by the aftermath of the Covid pandemic, the collapse of democratic institutions and a greater urban-rural divide with increasing communalization, crony capitalism, and marginalization creating divisions in the State and in the country. We are also faced by the challenges of the National Education Policy and experience the ill-effects of the devastation done to the environment. We need to combat these like warriors with a greater focus on our UAPs, PAPs and the DSS. What will help us combat these challenges is our deep and personal attachment to Jesus and his mission, being friends in the Lord, having greater love for the poor and the excluded, and discerning love.

Karnataka Province Sammelan 2023

The Karnataka Jesuits gathered for the Karnataka Province Sammelan from 28-30 December 2023



at Mount St Joseph, Bengaluru with the theme "Synodal Journey with Christ towards Reconciliation and Justice." Over two hundred Karnataka Jesuits participated in the meet. Fr Melvil Pereira SJ (KHM) and Fr Joseph Xavier SJ (MDU) were the observers for the Sammelan. Fr Gabriel Kharluni (KHM) represented the Kohima Region.

Dr Brinelle D'Souza, a professor at Tata Institute, Mumbai and a human rights activist gave an in-



spirational keynote address on the first day. Reflecting on the current situation in the country, she presented a course of action based on synodality. Her scholarly presentation coupled with her deep experience of working for the marginalized, set the tone for the Sammelan. In the afternoon, the Provincial, Fr Dionysius Vaz presented the state of the province. He placed before the province, the statistics in terms of number of Jesuits, the finances, the institutions and the projections for the future. On the second day we had the SWOC analysis reports of the six major commissions of the province followed by a panel discussion with the civil society activists Mr Clifton D'Rozario, Ms Brinda Adige and Dr Jerome Nirmalraj on



strengthening lay collaboration. Their appreciation for Jesuit education, their deep respect for the Jesuits who shaped their commitment and their advice for the future of lay collaboration in our province formed the basis of our spiritual conversation. The last day of the Sammelan was set aside for "charting out a road map for the future" and the interventions of the observers and various province commissions. The provincial, in his concluding remarks, highlighted the key insights of the Sammelan.

The movement of the Spirit was palpable in the carefully prepared liturgies, prayers before each session, the examen, spiritual conversations, group discussions and in the interventions following the presentation of reports. The prayer service for the departed members of the province reminded us of our fellow Jesuits who have gone before us and are now praying for us. The presence of the younger members moving freely

with the seniors, and the diversity and the camaraderie in the group were unmistakable signs of our Jesuit vocation and our desire to give our lives to Christ in service. The Sammelan was truly a Kairos moment as the evaluation affirmed it to

CONFERENCE ON APOSTOLIC PLANNING, ROME (DECEMBER 5-8, 2023) 😤 😁



In the heart of Rome, at the Conference on Apostolic Planning for Renewal and Transformation from December 5 to 8, I experienced a kairos moment.

The Aula of Curia hosted 120 participants, including women collaborators and 18 delegates from JCSA. Each day began with prayer, followed by talks providing a holistic framework for strategic planning, and culminating in a thanksgiving Eucharist. The emphasis was on conversion and the overarching renewal of the Society at every level. The talks underscored the importance of creating a culture of



planning and discernment, urging us to attune to the Holy Spirit's rhythm and radical newness.

On the second day, Fr General stressed that apostolic planning and preferences are fountains of hope and pathways to transformation. "Discernment is intrinsically a part of the apostolic planning process," he declared, highlighting the priority of listening to the Holy

Spirit and cultivating a deep relationship with the Holy Spirit. "Apostolic planning cannot only look at what we do; it must drink at the source of who we are. We are not only human-doers but human beings." He underscored the importance of reconnecting with the rhythms of life and mission, integral to our growth as Jesuits. In his insightful presentation, he delved into five types of conversion: shifting away from sectorial work, embracing movement and agility, connecting with the Holy Spirit, fostering interpersonal conversion, and embracing a newfound commitment to planning itself.

A moment of personal joy enveloped me as Fr General acknowledged JESCOL, the flagship programme of the Karnataka province. The conference facilitated the sharing of best practices and challenges in implementing preferences. Reuniting with three of my friends from Berkeley brought me great joy. Our Jesuit companions from the province in Rome, devoted to their studies, welcomed me with warmth and generous gestures, making me feel at home. They graciously guided me through Ignatian sites, weaving captivating stories supported by credible facts. As I left, lingering questions echoed: "What can we not achieve if only we work together? How do we re-imagine a renewed province and Society?" May our hearts pulsate with the Society of Jesus as we move with renewed agility in our mission of reconciliation and justice.

Meeting of Religious and Lay DoWs at FRH, Mangaluru





Twenty-two religious and lay directors of works (DOWs) of Karnataka Jesuit Province met for a two-day deliberation at Fatima Retreat House, Mangaluru on December 16-17. On the first day, Fr Dionysius Vaz SJ, the Provincial dealt on the theme, 'Building mission driven teams'. He said that it was important to align our work with the ultimate purpose of Jesuit education, namely forming men and women for and with others. On the second day, Fr Joseph D'Mello, the Socius to the Provincial spoke on De Statu Societatis Iesu. He highlighted the need for conversion in the area of collaboration. Fr Provincial also took a session on conflict management. The DOWs had time to meet in groups for



spiritual conversations and discuss and deliberate on various issues pertaining to their work.

In his final address, Fr Dion motivated the team to always keep Jesuit ideals in mind while performing their duty. "God calls us to collaborate in creating the world. Creation is not a onetime event, but creation is continually happening. God calls us to be co-creators, to labour with Him in building the world," he said. He also underlined that lay collaborators are equal partners. "Hence you must be motivated to do the task and you must be qualified and competent to do the task," he added. He further called upon the DOWs to understand what Jesuit education is all about. "Education in Jesuit institutions should not be simply a matter of imparting information and skill. It has to take note of the dimension of developing potentialities inherent in each student, instilling values and principles which will create in them a sharp social consciousness, sense of social justice and above all a true outlook and culture of solidarity and service," he said.

Earlier on the first day, the DOWs visited Jesuit institutions such as AlMIT Beeri, Aloysian Student Home, Nehru Nagar, and St Aloysius College. SAC community hosted them dinner where they had occasion to mingle with Jesuits.

BRO. BENEDICT ROSARIO (2 January 1948 – 13 January 2024)





We have come together in this Church of Divine Mercy at Fatima Retreat House to bid farewell to our dear departed Bro Benedict Rosario who passed to the Lord yesterday morning at Santhrupti, Jesuit Residence. Our sorrow and pain notwith-

standing, we firmly believe in the reality that our dear Bro. Benedict is in the hands of God our Father. We do grieve, but as people with hope.

Born at Ferar, Mangaluru on January 2, 1948, Bro Benedict celebrated his 75th birth anniversary a few days ago. Having joined the Society of Jesus on his 17th birthday, Benna (as we fondly called him) lived 59 years of his life as a committed Jesuit fulfilling a wide variety of ministries in different houses both in and out of the Province. The following list of assignments is a pointer to the multiple talents he possessed

and the solid trust his superiors reposed in him: St. Joseph's College, Bengaluru; St Joseph's Seminary, Mangaluru; Mount St. Joseph, Bengaluru; St. Aloysius College, Mangaluru; St Joseph's Industrial School, Ooty; Loyola Industrial Training Institute, Bengaluru; Vidyajyothi, Delhi; Jesuit House, Guwahati; Loyola Industrial Training Institute, Vijayapura; Loyola Higher Primary School, Bengaluru; St Joseph's Higher Primary School, Hassan; and Fatima Retreat House, Mangaluru, his last since 2019.

Remarkable in Bro Benedict was the assiduity with which he carried out the task assigned to him, be it as infirmarian or house minister or teacher or instructor. With joyful willingness he accepted, and with unwavering obedience he carried out, his administrative roles as Principal or Director of Technical Institutes, or as Administrator, Treasurer, Finance Officer of Jesuit Houses. He could shoulder these responsibilities thanks to the training he had received in the years of his formation: Fitter's Course at St Joseph's Technical Institute, Pune;

Theology at De Nobili College, Pune; Teartianship at Sacred Heart College, Shembaganur; and Technical Instructor's Course at Ooty, to name a few.

As a Jesuit who loved his Mother Dear the Society, he was looking forward to celebrating the diamond jubilee of his religious life later this year. Nine years ago, while celebrating his Golden Jubilee as a Jesuit, he received a congratulatory letter from the then Jesuit General Fr. Adolfo Nicolás. An extract from the letter is self explanatory: "... I can well imagine the memories and joys that must be surging in your heart today as your many friends and I join you in thanking God for the countless moments of grace that have come together to make up a half century of Jesuit commitment... With a shade of sadness ... I note that you have now the distinction of being the only Brother in the Karnataka Province..... I commend the whole Society and myself to your prayers and sacrifices...."

Writing in the column "Down Memory Lane" of the Karnataka Province Newsletter, Bro. Benna recalled the event of his final commitment in the Society in these words: "Some of my relatives were present to witness my final commitment in the Society on 15 August 1980, along with Fr Ravi Santosh Kamath, in St Joseph's Seminary, Mangaluru. Later, in 2015, ... the Golden Jubilee celebration of my entrance into the Society ... was a time to thank God for all He had done for me and through me, and to plead with Him for grace and strength to continue to work for His greater glory and for the good of His people....."

The unexpected and untimely departure of Br Benna has caused much pain and sadness to his close relatives, his former students, his friends and his fellow-Jesuits. For Benna himself, however, there is no more pain or sadness. From now on, we will remember him as one of our own who has been raised by God to fullness of life and who, together with the saints, will be interceding for us that one day we too might live in full union with the Risen Lord.

Those of us who have had the opportunity of knowing Bro. Benna from close quarters can never forget the warmth of his friendship, his affable dealings with all, his docility and availability for mission, and his diligence as a Jesuit. Deep down in his heart he had a soft corner for the poor and the needy, particularly his students in the technical schools and the domestics in our houses, to whom he quietly extended his loving support.

Two years ago, Bro Benna suffered a stroke which severely hampered the mobility of his limbs on the left side. He who had gladly accepted the role of an infirmarian to the senior Jesuits at Fatima Retreat House now became an ailing Jesuit himself. Amidst these impediments he continued to render whatever service he was able to, while, in the meantime, he made every possible effort – diet, physical therapy, massage, regular exercise, etc - to regain his mobility. The tardy progress attained by all these means was a challenge to the hope he had cherished of giving and not counting the cost, of fighting and not heeding the wounds, of toiling and seeking for no reward. He continued to assist at the daily Mass for the senior Jesuits in the residence chapel knowing well that the Risen Lord who had given him a share in His suffering in this life would surely admit him to the glory of His resurrection.

Adieu, Br Benna, till we meet again.

Dubrovnik Airport Named after a Jesuit

Dubrovnik Airport in Croatia was renamed Ruđer Bošković Airport on 2 November, after one of the most significant Jesuit scientists. Ruđer Bošković (1711-1787), who was also known as Rogerius Boscovicius and Roger Boscovich, was born in Dubrovnik and gained fame as one of the most influential physicists and mathematicians of his era. Bošković entered the novitiate in Rome and then worked mainly as a professor and researcher in Italy and France. He also wrote poems and worked for the diplomatic service of the Republic of Dubrovnik. Dubrovnik is a well-known tourist spot. Dubrovnik Airport has been active since 1936 and is Croatia's third major terminal, with 2.3 million passengers in 2022. The Society of Jesus has been active in Dubrovnik since its beginnings, with Nicola Bobadilla serving there for a few years from 1558. Boscovich received his education from the Dubrovnik Jesuit College, which began operating in 1658. (http://surl.li/pjxjv)
