# PROVINCIAL'S MUSINGS

he 16th General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops began in Rome on 4 October 2023 with synodality as the theme of discussion. Fundamentally, synodality is about journeying together. It has been a "journeying together" so far from the local Church to the Universal Church. "Walking together" is at the heart of what the Church is all about, as the People of God on pilgrimage in the midst of the world. A "synodal Church" is a Church which listens. In the words of Pope Francis, "It is a mutual listening in which everyone has something to learn. The faithful people, the college of Bishops, the Bishop of Rome: all listening to each other, and listening to the Holy Spirit." A synodal Church is a Church of encounter and dialogue. It promotes the passage from 'I' to 'we'. It is also a Church of discernment. (Instrumentum Laboris, no. 25).

What's unique about this Synod on synodality? Unlike past synods, this one is not about addressing a particular issue, but about becoming who God calls us to be as a Church, all of us together, amidst the reality of today's world. It is no longer only a one-month Synod of Bishops but a three-year synodal process for the entire People of God! All are invited and no one is to be left behind or excluded. Lay people have played a significant role in the preparation of this Synod, and now, for the first time ever, lay participants are full voting members. What is significant is that among the members of the Assembly include 14 Jesuits. Among the experts and facilitators, there are eight.

So, accompanying the members of the Synod, let us pray for the Church, "that she may adopt listening and dialogue as a style of life at every level, allowing herself to be guided by the Holy Spirit towards the world's peripheries." At the same time, let us reflect on synodality and its implications on Jesuit life and mission: by travelling and reflecting together

we will learn how to live in communion, to achieve participation, to open ourselves to mission. Our journeying together in synodality will make us a province that is truly pilgrim and missionary.

The Student Council celebrated Teachers' Day – both for the teaching and non-teaching staff – not only with sports and fun activities, but by personally delivering gifts to every staff member. A MoU between Pontificia Universidad Javeriana (Bogota, Colombia) and St Joseph's University has been formally signed. Prof Lope Hugo Barrero Solano (Dean, Dept of Industrial Engineering) and Dr Gloria Bernal (Co-Director, Lab of Economics of Edn) toured the campus and engaged in discussions with the Centre for Global Initiatives, exploring avenues of collaboration.

A hundred Tibetan PUC students from Bylakuppe - the world's second-largest Tibetan settlement - visited SJU campus, interacted with the faculty and students, and attended an orientation by the School of Business. SJU hosted the book release of "Gandhi, the Soul Force Warrior" written by Ambassador Pascal Alan Nazareth IFS (Retd). The book was released by our alumnus, Justice Sri Nitte Santhosh Hegde (former judge of the Supreme Court and Lokayukta of Karnataka).

The Office for International Affairs of SJU, in collaboration with Loyola University Chicago and other universities, organised a synodal encounter between Pope Francis and university students. The event, which was live-streamed on YouTube, displayed one of our students addressing the Holy Father on behalf of the SJU youth community. All the Schools and Departments of SJU put their best foot forward show-

casing their exhibits, specimens, models and presentations to scores of school children, students and the general public on the occasion of "Elixir," the Open Day University. The cynosure of all eyes was on the 'Jesuit Room' where portraits of Jesuit saints and posters on the history of the Society of Jesus were displayed. The secret behind this creative presentation was the efforts of Frs Francis Pinto and Maxim Dias and the assistance rendered by the scholastics.

The Karnataka State Higher Education Council sent a team of experts to visit our campus and assess the feasibility of starting new academic programmes. Going by the positive impression our infrastructure made on the team, we are hopeful of starting soon an MCA programme and a PhD in Biotechnology.

Fr Victor Lobo and the SJU team managed to secure the long awaited and much needed "Minority Certificate" from the State Government. What paid off in the long run in achieving this milestone was the persistent hard work of Fr Victor in preparing the documents, overcoming bureaucratic hurdles and engaging in negotiations with the authorities.

The pandemic Covid, the terrible explosion at Beirut port in 2020, and the Syrian refugee crisis have crippled the economy and the socio-cultural fabric of Lebanon.

We are thirteen tertians for the 2023-2024 programme: 3 from the Philippines, 2 from India, 2 from Canada, and 1 each from Myanmar, Poland, Hungary, Germany, France, and the US. The programme began on Sunday, September 24, with

a holy Eucharist followed by self-introductions. We had a common reading of Fr Kolvenbach's Directives on Tertianship so as to familiarise ourselves with the aims, objectives and means of our programme. Presently we are reading St Ignatius' autobiography, while each tertian is given time for writing his own autobiography.


