It is also an opportune moment to reflect on Ignatius' enduring legacy. Many things can be said of Ignatius' enduring legacy in terms of the gift or charism he received and that has been passed on to all of us. Jesuits and mission partners, therefore, "in keeping before their eyes God" are graced with finding the divine in their everyday experiences, whether in prayer or action. This is possible even in an era of declining faith and amidst a troubled, divided, and broken world. St Ignatius invites all of us to share in these wonderful gifts that he received and to share in that daily mystical experience of finding God in all things! I wish you a very happy feast of our founder and father, St Ignatius of Loyola.




