### **PROVINCIAL'S MUSINGS**

The JCSA had its biannual meeting in Loyola College, Chennai from 16-22 February 2025. The theme for the Major Superiors meeting was "Deepening the Process of Reimagining in South Asia." All the Major Superiors reviewed the progress of RR process both at the Province level and at the Conference level. The Conference Secretaries also presented a short report of their activities in the light of the RR process. All of us realized that the RR process is basically a call to the ongoing spiritual renewal and that it should be continued in the spirit of Ignatian Magis.

Fr. General, who was present during the meeting reflected on the following important issues on our life-mission:

- 1. He brought to our awareness the issue of our displaced loyalty to cultural identities like, race, ethnicity, language and caste. He invited us to become aware of this issue and discuss openly without fear. Every Jesuit is expected to introspect and transcend narrow loyalties to such cultural identities and celebrate his Jesuit identity.
- 2. The importance of maintaining the necessary tension between the 'Cura Personalis' and 'Cura Apostolica'. Excessive emphasis on either of this, at the cost of the other, will affect our life-mission.
- 3. To pay special attention to the implementation of the second phase of the UAPs.
- 4. Governance and Authority in the Society is for the mission. Governance should change and be adapted to the mission.
- 5. In the context of Reimagining and Restructuring, Major Superiors should strengthen the various apostolic networks, promote interprovincial collaboration and be responsible for interprovincial and supra provincial apostolic works.

During the meeting, the Magis Digital Home was inaugurated by Fr General in the presence of a number of youth. Chennai province partnering with Karnataka province has begun the initiative and eventually the whole Society will be involved in the whole project. During the inauguration, Fr General said, "We are starting this initiative because the Society of Jesus

believes in young adults. We believe in their creativity. We believe in their energy. We believe in their deep spirituality and interiority. We believe in their sense of solidarity. We believe in their hopefulness about the future. We believe in their passion about the common home in the face of the challenges faced by our planet."

We visited the Loyola Jesuit Community in Sreekaryam and played a friendly basketball match against the Loyola CBSE School team.



# DOWN MEMORY LANE

Fr Louis D'Souza S.J.

I was born on 11 February 1949 and was baptized as Louis. We were 10 siblings at home. My elder brother, younger sister, and two more younger brothers have gone up. I am kept in line to make a journey without a return ticket.

St Joseph's Higher Primary School – Fajir Parish School initiated me to a routine school life till I wrote my 7th std public exams in Anand Ashram High School at Kotekar as an outsider. In 1961, my Parish Priest, Fr Rosario Fernandes, helped me to sneak into the then Gonzaga House, the apostolic school for Jesuit aspirants. I could hardly distinguish between a Jesuit and a diocesan Priest till I passed 10th std. in St Aloysius High School in 1965. Along with 7 others, I was able to pass PUC in 1966. I had expressed my desire to join the Jesuits without knowing much about

them, except a few in the Gonzaga House. Hardly any Jesuit dared to visit any parish across the river Nethravathi or to Fajir before the river was bridged. Yet, to my good luck, Fr Alexander Castelino taught us rudiments of the ecclesial language – Latin, from 1962 till 1966 in Gonzaga House.

I proceeded to Bangalore with 4 other companions to join the Novitiate on 19th June 1966. The bus journey then was worth Rs. 16 from Mangalore to Bangalore. Only at the main gate of Mount St Joseph I said to myself, "I shall not take a step back home." It was a nondescript Novitiate formation, with a large number of Jesuits only, in and around the house. June 1968 onwards was a year of Juniorate at Mount St Joseph, with Fr Hilario Fernandes and Aloysius Prabhu as our mentors. Both are guiding us from above at present. 1969-1972, during college studies, I earned a BA and a BSc. We migrated to 3 venues in 3 years within the campus. All the Jesuit faces of those days, have gone up and away, never to return. The 3 years of Philosophy that followed from 1972-1975 was a crucial mix with Jesuits of other provinces, at Sacred Heart College, Shembaganur. Here, I could not pursue my desire to learn German and Greek with determination. What little I had learned is coming in handy even now; after 50 years, it was a lost opportunity that I regret.

Two years of regency in 1975-76 and 1976-77, at first in St Aloysius High School, Mangalore, and there at St Joseph's Church, Anekal, were decisive years in learning to practice religious life while at work. I got strengthened in my formation without much help from anywhere. I learned to live in the way I could.

1977-80, the 3 years of theology at De Nobili College, Poona, was an eye opener in a Jesuit crowd. One could easily be lost without focus in a vast campus crowded with students. I did not take chances, even with a delayed approval for the diaconate in 1980 and subsequent ordination. We were 5 deacons for ordination at the Milagres Church, Mangalore on 28-04-1980. Thereafter, it was at St Louis Boarding House and St Joseph's Indian High School, Bangalore, that the work made me shed weight, learning field games, and the like to be at service in the school till 1983, after a year of B.Ed. At R.V. Teachers' College and my subsequent Tertianship at Varanasi, I learned to combine work and worship. The tertianship for a mere 6 of us in 1983 was an unusual experience since there was hardly a house to conduct classes and conferences, solely by Fr Anthony Coelho, yet it was the time I learned to celebrate Mass in Hindi.

In May 1984, I returned to St Joseph's Indian High School for the next 6 years. The experience of a course in Ignatian Spirituality at four centers in different states of India was a semblance of a sabbatical for 8 months in 1990-91. On returning to Bangalore, I left for St Joseph's High School, Hassan, and had a taste of teaching in a rural school for 3 years. I returned to St Joseph's Indian High School, Bangalore, in 1994, and returned from School life in February 2007.

Since June 2007, Fatima Retreat House, Vidya Niketan, Dharwad, St Aloysius PU College Harihar, St Joseph's College Bangalore, and Loyola School Sindagi have been my temporary 'homes' for 16 years.

I landed at St Aloysius College, Mangalore, in May 2023. Looking for meaningful associations through Archives; I will be one of the subjects of archaic or archival material sooner or later.
