PROVINCIAL'S MUSINGS

August is a month that reminds us of our freedom when we celebrate our Independence Day and the Assumption of our Blessed Mother.

We should feel proud of our country for various reasons: for its noble culture, for its spiritual heritage, for the philosophy of life, and for scientific and technological accomplishments. But these accomplishments should not blind us to the present realities. Our land today is stricken with insurmountable problems. Our country is wounded and caught in the web of violence and terrorism, communalism, politicization of religion, omnipresent corruption, rural under-development, ecological and environmental crises, and injustice perpetrated against dalits, tribals, women and children.

On this occasion, it is good to remind ourselves of the contribution of Mahatma Gandhi, the great father of our nation. Salil Mishra has brought to life just how complex a character Gandhi had been, perhaps the greatest living statesman in history, a born leader and revolutionary, a man of extraordinary courage and vision and as a master of conflict resolutions, he would forge agreements with his fiercest critics. Gandhi's greatest contribution was non-violence which made great impact on leaders like Martin Luther King, Jr and Nelson Mandela. The reign of God requires a world organized not around violence, but around love and compassion. We need to create men and women who enter into the dynamic of God's reign with a nonviolent heart, confronting injustice responsibly and courageously, unmasking the inhumanity hidden in every society that is built on violence and indifference to the suffering of its victims.

We also celebrate the Assumption of our Blessed Mother. Mary is a great model of disciple-ship. *Elizabeth Johnson*, a feminist theologian says, "Mary is revealed as a village woman who knows hard work, who gives birth in a stable because of a government decree, who becomes a refugee because of a ruler's murderous intent, who knows how to

celebrate a wedding, who loses her son to unjust execution by the State. Through it all she keeps faith in God. Most startling, she announces the coming justice of God in her great song of liberation: "God will put down the mighty from their thrones and exalt the lowly."

DOWN MEMORY LANE

Fr T Paulose Vellakada

I was born on 28 July 1952 at Chungakkuan, a village of the then Cannanore district (now Wayanad) of Kerala for late Mr Thomas and Mrs Mariam Vellakada who were pious Syrian Catholics. Being the sixth child among the siblings, I enjoyed my childhood with lots of fun, mischief and daily family prayers at home. Three of my elder sisters are religious and one brother was a diocesan priest who died at an early age due to Leukemia. Two of my paternal aunts were also nuns one of whom Sr. Marie Celine BS who was responsible for my college studies at St Aloysius College, Mangalore. During my college studies, I got acquainted with Jesuits which eventually led me to join Karnataka Jesuit Province.

After my graduation I was sent to Vinayalaya Bombay on 10 July 1974 for my first year of Novitiate along with Fr Clarence D'Souza who was my classmate from PUC through graduation. Being with Fr Vincent Banon as a Novice Master was a great experience where we had also various apostolates among lepers, Cheshire homes, homes for the aged, slums and tribals. We moved to Mount St Joseph for the second-year novitiate under Fr Hilario Fernandes.

I had no Juniorate but was asked to learn Kannada under a private tutor for few months and then was sent to Aadigondanahalli at the request of Fr Thomas Pinto to teach Catechism and take tuition for school children in Kannada.

I was in DNC-Pune between 1977-79 for philosophy, after which a year of Regency at Anekal working as supervisor for the newly started National Adult Education Program (NAEP). Again, I returned to DNC for Theology (1980-83) and was ordained at

St Joseph's Boys' High School Chapel on 09 April, 1983. I was fortunate enough to have my Dad who was suffering



from cancer, present for my ordination and he died on 31 May 1983. My mother also died of cancer on 30 May 1976 a month before my first vows. Fortunately, by the generosity of Mother Society, I was able to spend some time with my ailing mother before her death.

After my ordination, I was sent to Anekal for Social Apostolate (1983-84) and thereafter I studied MSW in Roshini Nilaya for two years. In 1986, I was appointed as the Director of Social Work in Mundgod while Fr Pradeep Sequeira was the Superior and Parish Priest of St Rita's Church. After a year he was also transferred and I was left alone as the Director of Social work and Parish Priest. This was the time I tried to uphold the dignity of the Siddis in Mainalli by cultivating paddy on co-operative basis. I also built a godown to store their agricultural products, a poultry, a borewell, a public toilet facility and a rice mill, all managed by the Siddis themselves. In the meantime, the social work had expanded among other Siddis, SCs and Gowlis. In 1991 when Lawrence Pinto arrived at Mundgod, I helped him out in identifying and buying property for the Loyola School and the Social Centre (present LVK) was used as residence cum school for the first few batches.

In 1992 I was sent for Tertianship at Sitagarha after which I was transferred to Bijapur Mission as the Director of Social Work. We began literacy programmes and nurseries both in Bijapur slums and in Sindagi Taluka. Initially I took a house of two rooms on rent and used a front yard as office and various training

programmes for Balwadi teachers, social workers and Sangha leaders. After two years we bought the old Maitri Sadhana building and the sites behind and shifted the office to the newly purchased building.

In 1993 Lathur Earthquake caused havoc to many lives. I went to Lathur and did not start any rehabilitation work there because many NGOs came forward to help out. But a few weeks later, there was torrential rains in Bijapur which brought down many houses especially Sindagi area. So, we started the rehabilitation and repairing the houses on a massive scale with the assistance of Terre des Homes and other agencies. Our novices and scholastics had ample opportunities especially during summer in building the houses and to know the rural realities.

We also built houses in Thaddewadi of Indi Taluka with the financial assistance of Karnataka Religious units. Then in 1996 we started the Child Labour Schools at the request of the District Commissioner which brought the Centre for Non-formal Education (CNFE) to the limelight. By this time, we also negotiated for the Loyola School and ITI properties. Though there were many legal hurdles we succeeded in purchasing both the properties. In all this Fr Claude D'Souza's support was remarkable.

In 2003 I was given a year of sabbatical in COADY INTERNATIONAL, Canada and JSTB both with scholarships. After my return from sabbatical, I was

appointed as the Director of Jnana Jyothi for three years. In 2006, though I was appointed to St Aloysius College Mangalore, God had some other plan for me. I had an opportunity to opt for British Guyana and it was accepted providentially. It was the turning point in my life, because I moved from social apostolate to a pastoral field, which gave me a disposition of detachment and to take up any mission given to me by my superiors. Though one of the British Provincials told me that the mission you are in is the most difficult of all the British province missions, I found it very fulfilling and satisfying for where else would I have the opportunity of baptizing over 2000 persons.

Though most of them were infants and Catholics not having Eucharist for months and years, I had an opportunity to participate in the Eucharist. When I review the past 72 years of my life, 50 years are my Jesuit religious life. I am literally overwhelmed with the deep sense of gratitude. All the people who came into my life, the events and experiences which have unfolded with mixed feelings, the places I have travelled, various encounters with people of all walks of life - these and more I thought were accidents, chances or co-incidences but actually they are all God's will and divine directed providence for me.

I am eternally grateful to the Society of Jesus for giving me the opportunity to serve the last, the least and the lost.
